TOPIC: Presenting research, design, and ideas through FLIPGRID	FORMAT:

COMMON CORE STANDARDS:

ACTIVITY:

Students will use FLIPGRID on present their ideas for the addition of a natural play feature to the schoolyard. This presentation should be a summary of the essay students wrote for Lesson 3, their hand drawn map and feature drawings from Lesson 4, including the benefits of the specific play feature, the location where they want it installed and why. Students can vote for their 2 favorite designs by using the "Like" function on FLIPGRID.

Note to teachers: You can make your students' ideas a reality! Bring the most liked videos to the Board of Education, along with the corresponding essays and let the students' work speak for itself.

EVIDENCE OF ACTIVITY (WHAT TO TURN IN):

Students will submit video responses to the teacher through email, FLIPGRID or present orally in class.
