





Animal watch in backyard/park! Take journal, to quiet spot & listen/watch for animals. Use binoculars to see animals in the distance & compass to see what direction they are going & coming from. Use Animal ID Guides/Track ID Sheet to ID tracks/animal sightings. Measure tracks with measuring tape. Use flashlight to animal watch at night in your backyard. JOURNAL IDEA: record animals like in the story.

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Zoo in the Sky

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Go outside on a clear, dark night. Using the star map in the book (bring your flashlight to see your star chart) look up into the night sky to see how many star animals you can locate or make up your own! (Wear your Imagination Butterfly Band!) Use your compass to pinpoint their location. Look at the stars & moon through your binoculars.

JOURNAL IDEA: draw your favorite sky zoo animal.
