## Winter Trees

Go on winter tree walk! Play tree charades imitate tree shape \& have someone guess the tree! Count how many nests are in the bare trees - use binoculars to look up high. Wear Imagination Butterfly Band - how many letters are formed by branches in trees? Use magnifier and Leaf Scar ID sheet to discover tree faces. Make a twig tower pile up twigs you find on the ground - measure height with measuring tape! JOURNAL IDEA: Draw tree face you find.


## Keep Looking

Sit quietly outside for 10 minutes - See any winter animals? Use binoculars to see animals/tracks in the distance. Use Track ID Sheet. Use shovel to pile up old fall leaves \& twigs in corner of yard for shelter for animals/bugs. Find winter natural objects to match all color chips in rainbow tool bag. Use tweezers to pick up tiny bits of winter color put them into magnifier boxto see closely \& make rainbow, put in treasure chest.


## Stranger In the Woods

Make your own "Stranger in the Woods" (or in your backyard) to feed animals by following "Recipe for a Snowman" in back of book! Use measuring tape to measure how tall \& big around snowman is. Next day watch from a secret hiding place to see which animals visit. Locate animals through binoculars.
Use Animal ID Book to ID animals/birds. PHOTO IDEA: Imagination Butterfly Band on snowman.

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## Midnight Snowman

Gather up family, friends \& neighbors - together roll the biggest snowball ever! When it can't roll any more, use shovel to pack on more snow. Have everyone add stuff to it to make a snow "thing!" Use measuring tape to see how tall/big around it is. JOURNAL IDEA: Draw picture of "snow thing". PHOTO IDEA: Imagination Butterfly Band on "snow thing" with by Caroline Feller Bauer everyone who helped roll it.


## Snowballs

Wear Imagination Butterfly Band - gather good STUFF - wait for snowball day to make snow twins of your family members! Use measuring tape to measure how tall/long each family member is to make their snow twin that size. Be colorful! Can you match all the color chips in rainbow tool bag to something on the snow family? PHOTO IDEA: everyone standing by their snow twin! by Lois Ehlert

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## Owl Moon

Listen to Owl Call CD/look at Owl ID book (in back of book). Go on a full moon, night walk. Use compass to see where moon is in sky. With binoculars, look at moon, locate owls. Call in owls by imitating owl calls from CD. Wear Imagination Butterfly Band-sit still in moonlight - look for animal shapes in clouds passing over moon. Stand facing each other - how many steps backwards can you go and still see each

## Snow

Take a snow walk \& "see how beautiful the world is." Catch snowflakes on mitten or frozen black paper - discover their designs with magnifier. Catch snowflakes on your tongue! Make snow angels! Roll down a snow hill! Make ICE ART: find nature objects outside, put in water in cup/saucer with piece of string, freeze, remove from container, hang outside. JOURNAL IDEA: Draw snow crystal observed with magnifier or draw/write your favorite memory of fun with snow/ice.

## All You Need for A Snowman

Catch snowflakes on your mitten - look at their differences with magnifying glass. Build a surprise snowman for a neighbor/friend/family member! Wait till they are not home or after dark (use flashlight) \& quietly build a friendly snowman to greet them when they return home or wake up in morning! Make sign for snowman to hold with welcoming message! JOURNAL PHOTO IDEA: Draw or take photo of snowman with message!
