Adopting a “toolbox” approach can guide career growth and success

Versatile Toolbox Concept



Diverse experiences, skills, and adaptability create a valuable, resilient career "toolbox."

Example: Learning budgeting in one job can apply to managing resources in another role, even outside of finance. Every skill or experience is a tool you can use later in unexpected ways.



Emphasize that each role, skill, and challenge contribute to career growth, making you a more indispensable asset.

Example: Developing public speaking skills through leading meetings can later help when you need to present projects to senior management confidently.

Reflecting on Personal Career Journey



Career Growth Story – From Lifeguard to Director:

- **Each experience creates value, insight and skills.**
Example: Starting as a lifeguard might teach responsibility and customer service. Moving up to roles like Program Coordinator or Assistant Director can build management, budgeting, and program development skills.
- **Patience in career progression, as each role offers learning experiences that shape professional development.**
Example: Emphasize that skills like leading a team or understanding department budgeting often come with time and experience.

Each Position has skills to be learned!

Community center management

- Value of understanding costs and revenue generation
- Learning that the success of a program often depends on how well costs are managed can help you when planning new programs.

Learning how various funding and cost-recovery methods informs program development and resource management.

- Knowing when to use grant funding or when to use a cost-recovery model can ensure programs are sustainable and continue serving the community.



Building and Leveraging Your Career Toolbox

Treat Career Experiences as Tools

Classes, educational sessions, mentors, co-workers, and past positions all serve as tools for personal and professional growth.

- **Example:** A conflict management class, for instance, provides you with techniques that are useful in both workplace disagreements and client relations.

Describe how each experience brings different skills and knowledge that contribute to career versatility.

- **Example:** Working in customer service helps build people skills; project management classes provide organizational tools.

Diverse Skill Set for Well-Rounded Development

- Broad skill set prepares you for varied challenges and enhances career resilience.
- Having both technical and people management skills can help you navigate challenging projects with ease.
- Specific skills, skills just learned, or skills you are learning now may not be needed immediately but can often become valuable in future roles.



Future Value of Learning Experiences

- Knowledge not directly applicable to your current role builds a foundation for future growth.

Example: Attending a seminar on digital marketing may not apply immediately, but it may benefit you later if your role expands to include promotional activities.

- Be open to learning and embracing new experiences, as they may be key to seizing future opportunities!

Example: One team may favor a community-funded program model, while another uses a revenue-generating approach. Both models can be successful depending on the program's goals.

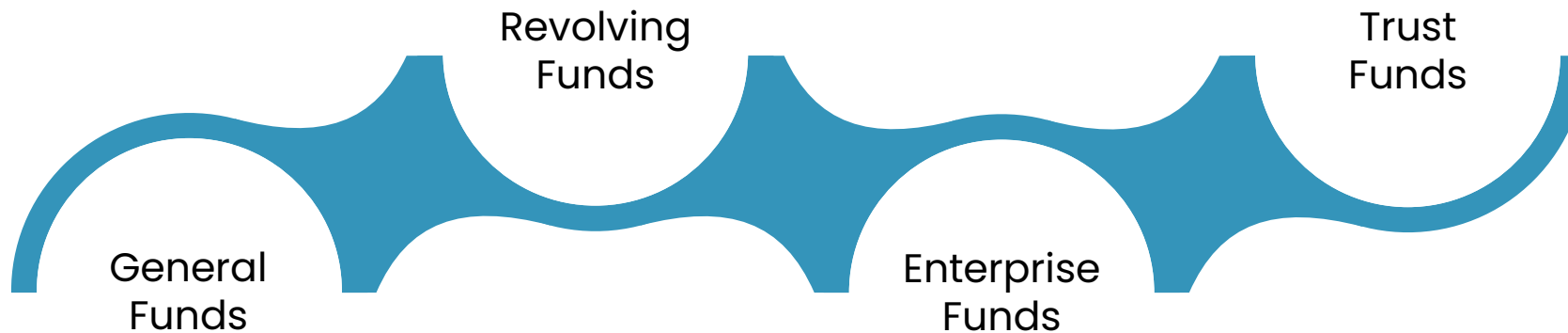


Have an open to enhancing adaptability and perspective

Essentials and Desirables in Community Roles

- Our we essential? Who is essential? Who is desirable? Who is desirable and essential?
- Defining Essential vs. Desirable Services:
 - Essential services (e.g., police, fire) and Desirable services (e.g., recreation).
 - Emphasize the role of Parks and Recreation in creating vibrant communities, making them indispensable.



Icing on the Cake” – The Woody Palmer Story

- Parks and Recreation, while often viewed and begin as “desirable,” adds immense value to communities.
- Programs like senior recreation not only enhance the community experience but also play a role in the well-being and social inclusion of residents.
- Highly valued, Parks and Recreation services become essential in enhancing community well-being.
 - Example: Recreation programs that encourage exercise help reduce healthcare costs, adding to the community’s overall health.



Mastering Mindfulness and Stress Management

Managing Daily Noise and Perspective

Minor distractions if allowed can become major distractions

- Learn how to filter out the “noise”
- Don’t get caught in other people’s noise

5+5 Rule

Limit time spent dwelling on minor issues, freeing up mental space for meaningful tasks.

- If it won’t matter in five years, don’t spend more than five minutes stressing about it.



Mastering Mindfulness and Stress Management

Perspective Scale for Mistakes

- Scale mistakes to their actual impact to gain a balanced perspective.
- What was your last mistake you made and how did it effect you?
 - Compare that to something on a large scale and how does that compare?
 - Example: Misplacing a file may feel stressful, but in the grand scheme, it has a minimal impact and can be quickly resolved.

Daily Reflection and Goal Setting

- Take the beginning of your work-day to reflect on the day before and determine your goals for the day.
- Take the end of your work-day to reflect what you accomplished and transition from work to your personal life.
 - Example: Silent Drives for Mental Reset - silent drives as a mindfulness technique for clearing the mind and transitioning smoothly between work and personal life.

The value of Understanding People

Surrounded by Idiots by Thomas Erikson

- A study about learning more about understanding and engaging others effectively.
- Recognizing our own characteristics will teach us to engage with a variety of different personalities
- Recognizing a co-worker's style as “Supportive” (S) may guide you to communicate with more patience and attention to their preferences.
- Adapting to personality differences enhances team cohesion and effectiveness.
 - Example: Learning time management from a mentor can help you set achievable goals early in your career.

Mentorship as a Career Tool

- The mentor's role is to shape individuals while creating a lasting positive impact.
- We will have many mentors in our life that create a painting of who we are...
- The mentor relationship creates a cycle of knowledge-sharing and personal growth.

- Shared vision
 - A vision where each team member feels part of the mission and values.
- Leading by example, supporting the team, and empowering team members.

View failures as learning opportunities, use setbacks to refine and improve future programs.

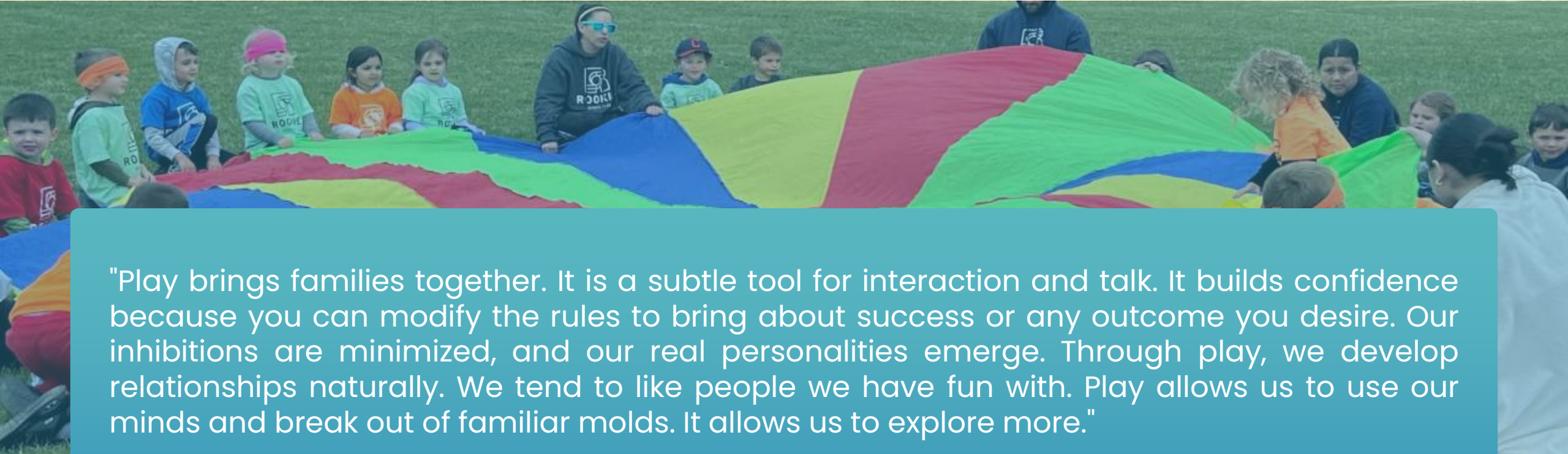
- Rule of three times to get it to work!
 - Ask yourself why it did not work and what can you and cannot change?
 - Example: A low turnout at a music festival could lead to changes, such as adjusting event timing or selecting a different genre, based on community feedback.
- My biggest failure and what I learned.



Special Events that Attract the Community

- It is important to understand community preferences rather than personal tastes when designing events.
- Use technology to create targeting and market campaigns to increase engagement and attract the right audiences.
- Facebook – Create an event page but do not forget that you have it!
 - Share, share and share again
 - Find pages that want to learn more!
- Google Business – Create a listing for your department!
 - Monitor and update it
