Stillwater Prairie Reserve, Rangeline and Maple Ridge

Natural Features

- 429.8 acres total
- Native Ohio prairie, part of Annie Oakley Corridor
- Mature and diverse woodlands
- Wetland with observation platform
- 3 fishing ponds and 3 wildlife ponds
- Scenic Stillwater River

Facilities

- Shelter with electricity and a grill
- 1600' boardwalk through prairie habitat
- Picnic areas with grills
- 8.2+ miles of trail
- River access and scenic overlook
- Maple syrup operation (January-March)
- Suspension Bridge over Scenic Stillwater River

9750 St. Rt. 185 and 7790 N. Rangeline Road - Covington

Situated along the Scenic Stillwater River in northwest Miami County. A circular hiking trail passes through fields, woodlands, marshy habitats and shrub lands. Segments of the main trail follow along the river.

Three man-made ponds and the Stillwater River provide fishing opportunities for visitors. Diverse topography and vegetation make this park a perfect place for hiking, picnicking, bird watching and cross-county skiing.

10430 St. Rt. 185 - Maple Ridge - Covington

Located along the Scenic Stillwater River with very unique topography. Rolling hills stretch from the upland prairie through the woodland ravines and on to the Stillwater River. A large stand of mature maple trees provides sap for the on-site educational maple sugaring operation.

Open 365 days a year from 8 a.m. to sunset.



A fishing license is not required to fish the Miami County Park District ponds; however, a license is required if fishing in any river. You may keep any fish you catch from the ponds with the exception of bass which must be at least 14" to keep.
