

What Do Animals Need?


The "The What Do Animals Need?" (WDAN) program information you received stated that part of the craft will be making capes out of t-shirts. This year we ask that all teachers participating in the WDAN program to prepare the t-shirts before our arrival. Perhaps a parent volunteer would be willing to help with shirt preparation. Each student will need an oversized t-shirt, large

or adult size works best (their actual size will work too if they don't have a larger size). The t-shirt should be white or light colored t-shirt. It is OK if the shirt has an image on the front as it will be cut away when making the cape. We are urging students to re-use their parent's old shirts if possible. We thank you in advance preparing the shirts before our staff member pre-stamps them.

First make sure the names are in the tag area of the t-shirt with permanent marker. Then using fabric scissors if you have them (if not any adult scissors will do, preferably sharp ones):


STEP ONE

Cut both arms off on the inside of the seam.




STEP TWO

In the armpits of the sleeveless t-shirt, make a snip with the scissors in a downward direction. Then rip the shirt straight down both of the sides. Use scissors to help if needed (sometimes it does not rip straight so you may need to cut).



STEP THREE

Cut a horizontal line across the breast of the shirt 4-5 inches down from the collar.



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
